The last round of lessons has been scheduled for the 2009 year. Please notice that lessons will be held on Fridays from 1p—5p on September 25 and October 2 at Hermitage Golf Course. This concept is part of our professional development strategy. Nearly 55% of the GROW membership consists of Corporate employees. I encourage you to get involvement from your organization's leadership, some companies may support the professional development initiative and cover the cost. There is also a corporate rate that includes two rounds of golf. A formal communication piece is being finalized. The cost is \$179 for the two sessions, 8 hours of training still at a negotiated price for GROW.
